Lilith's return seemed to take place after Heaven had closed it's gates. naksloth: Also ain't developers stated that Diablo 4 events happen 20 years later of the events break out in Diablo 3? No, as far as I know of, they only stated "decades". At the time D4 was first unveiled, some (including myself) merely assumed that it was twenty years. naksloth: I believe Tyrael is up there somewhere and alive, it's only two decades. If he is dead, writers will come up with something to revive him in High Heavens as an angel again which he would be locked in with others. It's unlikely for Tyrael to remain in Heaven since he willing chose to live in Sanctuary during the events of the Storm of Light novel. So if Tyrael's there, it's either against his own will or he died, and it's his replacement Archangel who's in the High Heavens. TWOEASY: I dont think its a prequel, it is probably a flashback or maybe its 2nd time he trying to stop her or maybe one of many times he is back to stop her. It's definitely not a prequel as you said. However it's unlikely to be a flashback due to the following reasons: Since there's obviously humans under Inarius' command in the cinematic, we know that this wasn't during the Eternal Conflict, specifically before Inarius had met Lilith, when Heaven and Hell openly engaged one another, because Humans and Nephalems hadn't existed then. So this had to be after Sanctuary's creation. Since this was after Sanctuary's creation, and there are human followers, this means that Lilith would be trapped in the Void (not Hell) by herself until the events of the Sin Wars. Prior to his imprisonment, Inarius never traveled to Hell after the creation of Sanctuary, instead he stayed in Sanctuary until he was defeated and then given to Mephisto for Imprisonment and torture. 1 Like Your comment has nothing to do with my quote. Lorath is a central character that has apparently aged about 30 years in Diablo 4. All I am saying about that so as to avoid spoilers. 1 Like D4 takes place 40 years after the events of RoS. Killing Tyrael is like killing the game. I doubt that. Besides, they would have revived him like Diablo anyway. Tyrael is now what he calls "mortal" but he is not mortal, he can only be killed, he is thousands of years old and cannot die of old age. He has taken his place in Angiri's council now as a "human". And 100% he will come back in D4 later. Page 3 Phalas: He has taken his place in Angin's council now as a "human". Tyrael had left the anglris council, and heaven during the Storm of Light novel, which takes place between D3 and D3 RoS. Also, he mentions that he may die of old age, similar to humans. However considering Lorath referred to the grave as "old friend". Tyrael is the likeliest candidate imo considering the following: Tyrael was the one to recruit Lorath within the Horadrim, and as such is the one Lorath knew the longest. Tyrael and Lorath worked together, with Lorath giving Tyrael's update or information regarding a situation (such as Skovos Isles), and in turn is entrusted by Tyrael to run important tasks (Tyrael trusted Lorath with finding our character in RoS). Avalon: Did Lorath refer to Tyrael as "Brother" in RoS? Not that I know of. However, assuming enough time had passed (decades), I wouldn't find it surprising if Lorath and Tyrael became close like brothers, to the point that Lorath could refer to Tyrael as "brother". In all honesty, I don't see anyone else Lorath would refer to as Brother besides Tyrael, especially when he's telling the grave that Hell's coming. In the end, we'll find out in June. Oblivion: Tyrael had left the anglris council, and heaven during the Storm of Light novel, which takes place between D3 and D3 RoS. Doesn't RoS literally end with Tyrael entering the council as Wisdom? Ah, nevermind that's vanilla. Correct. Diablo 3 vanilla ended with Tyrael choosing to take his place at the Angiris Council as Wisdom rather than Justice (and thus taking Malthael's place). The storm of light novel detailed some of Tyrael's activities while within Heaven, as well as his difficulties adapting to living there as a mortal (For example, needing sleep and food). The ending of the novel, pretty much depicts Tyrael leaving Heaven (after successfully stealing the black soulstone) in order to rejoin the new Horadrim on Sanctuary, as he now considers Sanctuary his home. Tyrael is an important character in the Diablo universe, who has saved mankind from evil and darkness multiple times. He was an angel and Archangel of Justice in Diablo 2, and became mortal in Diablo 3 and its expansion. Does Tyrael show up in Diablo IV though? This guide will answer the question if Tyrael appears in the latest sequel. Tyrael does not appear as a playable or non-playable character in Diablo IV. He also does not appear within the story of Diablo IV other than a few references from characters explaining the past. The biggest reference to him in the game would be the Horadric Initiate's Amulet item in the game. Its description reads: "A bronze relief depicting the visage of the Archangel Tyrael hung on a fine cord. Various additional ornaments have been added to the amulet including one depicting a trio of forbidding ancient gods." There is an angel that does make an appearance in Diablo 4. His name is Inarius and does bare a similar resemblance to Tyrael, but no official word has been given there.Related: How to Check How Much Time You've Played Diablo 4The other, much smaller mention of Tyrael is within the Horadric Initiate's Amulet item, which mentions Archangel Tyrael by name but nothing more. This is likely just a nod to the previous statement about Tyrael, rather than anything concrete. As for the rest of the angels, the reason for their missing appearance is due to the Heavens still trying to rebuild 50 years later following the events of Diablo 3. The only other angel we meet is Inarius, though this is after he was cast out of Heaven for creating Sanctuary in the first place. While this is written in the lore, the primary development reason for the other Angels not being present is due to the team wanting to ground the game, which appears to have been a smart choice.If Tyrael appears in any of the promised expansion packs, we'll be sure to update this article to mention him. With a track record of helping players out and defending humanity, you would expect him to return to play a role in taking down Lilith. But before that, let's take you through what we know about Tyrael in Diablo 4. Check out all the details about Diablo 4 Season 1 as well. Who is Tyrael? Tyrael is an Angel who holds the title of Aspect of Justice on the Aegis Council of the High Heavens. He fought with the other Angels against Diablo, and since Diablo 2 has acted as a protector of humanity against all non-mortal threats. In Diablo 2, he is rescued by the protagonist of that game, helping them on their quest to defeat the Prime Evils and Diablo. In Diablo 3, he is banished from the Aegis Council for helping humanity during the events of Diablo 2. Following this, the Angels are attacked by Diablo's forces and end up siding with Tyrael and humanity to take Diablo down. At the end of Diablo 3, Tyrael is offered the chance to become an Angel again but declines in favour of staying in Sanctuary and continuing to defend humanity. Is Tyrael in Diablo 4? Despite remaining in Sanctuary after the events of Diablo 3, Tyrael is not in Diablo 4. While you would expect him to play a role given his commitment to protecting humanity, Tyrael does not feature at all in Diablo 4's main story, playing no role in taking down Lilith. You can find carvings of him in some locations, but that's the limit of his appearances in the game. While he hasn't made any appearances in Diablo 4 so far, that doesn't mean we won't see him in the game at all. As a live-service game, we can expect to receive plenty more major content for Diablo 4 for a long time to come, and we wouldn't be surprised if Tyrael makes a return in a major update sometime in the future. As for now, though, fans will have to make do without him. That's everything we know so far about Tyrael in Diablo 4.
