Branchburg's history is deeply rooted in its agricultural past, and this heritage is celebrated through various community events and local farm markets. The township is also home to the Branchburg Sports Complex, one of the largest indoor recreation facilities in the area. The median age is 42.3 years, with a lower percentage of residents under the age of 18 compared to other parts of the country. Branchburg Township has undergone significant development in recent years, with the construction of the 31 Tannery Project, a corporate headquarters that serves as a hub for various businesses. This project has not only created jobs but also helped establish Branchburg as a hub for innovation and entrepreneurship. The township's commitment to sustainability is evident in its efforts to create net-zero electric commercial buildings. The 42,000-square-foot office building, completed in 2006, was the first of its kind in New Jersey and set a new standard for environmentally friendly construction. Branchburg has also made headlines in recent years due to its successful baseball team, the Bulldogs, which won the 2012 14U Babe Ruth World Series Championship. The underdog team's victory is a testament to the township's dedication to sports development and community engagement. ###The Township Committee is composed of five members elected by the residents to serve on the committee and as mayor for specific terms. These include Anna P. Columbus (R, term ends December 31, 2024), Deputy Mayor Thomas L. Young (R, term ends 2025; term as deputy mayor ends 2024), Brendon Beatrice (R, 2024), David Owens (R, 2025) and James G. Schworn (R, 2026). ###ARTICLEBranchburg Township offers various public services including Emergency Medical Services and Rescue Services provided by the Branchburg Rescue Squad. The three-officer team received an Exceptional Duty Award for their bravery during a call, highlighting the squad's commitment to protecting residents. Additionally, the township relies on community donations to fund its volunteer-based rescue operations. ###ARTICLEThe Neshanic Station Historic District was added to the NRHP in 2016 for its significance in community development, preserving a piece of history. The district includes the Neshanic Station Lenticular Truss Bridge that spans across the South Branch Raritan River.[120] A notable schoolhouse from this era can be found in Neshanic Station, featuring colonial revival style architecture. In the realm of notable individuals connected to Branchburg, one finds names like Christopher Bateman (born 1957), a senator who served as mayor of Branchburg in 1986[121]. Raymond Bateman (1927-2016) was a politician representing Somerset County in the New Jersey Senate during the 1960s and 1970s. Sean Baker (born 1971) is an Oscar-nominated film director known for his Palme d'Or winning films. Frank Chapot (1932-2016) earned Olympic silver medals as an equestrian. Jeffrey Chiesa (born 1965), the former New Jersey Attorney General, temporarily took office in the US Senate to fill Frank Lautenberg's seat from June 2013. Famous residents include Robert Cox (1813-1890), who served time in Michigan's House of Representatives. Denise Coyle (born 1953) was a member of the New Jersey General Assembly and briefly held the role of Branchburg mayor. Notable for collecting literature, Mary Eccles, Viscountess Eccles (1912-2003), established an extensive library. Other prominent figures include Anthony Gargiolo (born 1984), who played football in the Canadian Football League, and Bob Masterson (1915-1994), a National Football League player. Comedian Brendan O'Hare is recognized for his absurdist humor in various podcasts. Branchburg township, located in Somerset County, New Jersey, has undergone significant changes over the years. The population of Branchburg township was recorded as 1143 in 1850, which increased to 1174 by 1860 and further rose to 1251 by 1870. North Branch is a village within this township. As reported by Debow's Seventh Census of the United States: 1850, the population growth of Branchburg township can be attributed to various factors such as agriculture and industry. In 1870, the township was still reliant on these sectors for its economic prosperity. The 1890 census revealed that Branchburg township had a total population of 2567. Subsequent censuses in 1900, 1910, and 1930 further recorded growth in the township's population. By 1940, the population had risen to 3153, followed by continued growth over the years. According to the 2020 United States Census, Branchburg township has a total population of 12,955. The township is governed by a Township Committee, comprising of seven members elected by the residents. Somerset County, New Jersey, is located in the central part of the state and includes five municipalities: Franklin Township, Hillsborough Township, North Plainfield Borough, South Brunswick Township, and Branchburg Township. The county is situated about 30 miles southwest of New York City and serves as a major hub for transportation and commerce. The charming township of Branchburg, New Jersey, boasts a picturesque blend of farmland and residential settings, featuring condominiums, estates on 10-acre parcels, and a rural campus atmosphere at Raritan Valley Community College.
