Which did you go to? • Basically, if your ultimate goal is the 36 doctoral/grad credit VUL DHA, you really don't need a specific Masters in Health Administration for entry. The main requirement is you will need a minimum of 90 graduate credits beyond the Bachelor's degree in order to finish off the degree... Otherwise, you will need an externship that can be up to 24 credit hours. So, the best bet is to get two quick Masters through Competency Based Education providers... an example would be the UMPI MAOL CBE + Walden MHA Tempo, they shouldn't be sharing the same courses (hopefully, no overlapping courses to give you the full/max of 60 credits). • Sounds easy enough!
