Capitalization: A search for New York Times is the same as a search for new york times. Tip 5: Find quick answers For many searches, Google provides answers directly in the search results. Some features, such as details about sports teams, aren't available in all regions. Weather: Search weather to find the weather in your location or add a city name, like weather seattle, to find weather for a certain place. Dictionary: Put define in front of any word to find its definition. Calculations: Enter a math equation such as 3*9123, or solve complex graphing equations. Unit conversions: Enter any conversion, such as 3 dollars in euros. Sports: To find a schedule, game scores, and more, search for the name of your team. Quick facts: Search for the name of a celebrity, location, movie, or song to find related info.
