Periodically means at set or scheduled times.Regularly means frequently, or habitually, although it can also mean at regular (evenly spaced) intervals.That said, I frequently hear periodically used to hint at the fact that the intervals may be fairly long, especially if there is a pause before the word. (the dog's tail, the man's hat, the cat's eyes) Yes, it is necessary when speaking of possession. However, I'm not so sure about this specific word: Cashier's check. Either, 1. One uses the 's because it speaks of possession. The check is of the cashier, it belongs to him/her, it describes possession. Or, 2. One doesn't use the 's because this is simply a fixed compound noun. Someone? This thread talks about using the 's on words that already end in s. However, it is based on using the 's as the possessive. You might find it useful. Hmmm.... I did a bit of digging on this one. Like other posters for whom certain things do not "sound" correct, cashiers check without the "apostrophe" simply does not look correct to me. I may be in the minority, however. When I performed a google search for "cashiers check" (no apostrophe) I got slightly over 2 million hits. When I did the same for "cashier's check" (with apostrophe), I got 1.9 million hits. Not much of a difference, but a difference nonetheless. Technically speaking, a cashier's check is a check that is drawn on the bank and is signed by a cashier and/or bank officer. As such, even though you will be taking the cash, the check itself belongs to the bank. To that end, I would stay with the possessive cashier's check. Of course, this might also be a case where I find justification for my own particular preference on the matter. Others are welcome to disagree. Hmmm, I have always seen the word written as "cashier's check" with the apostrophe. It appears that way in my dictionaries. And yes, it does look "correct" with the possessive apostrophe. Therefore, I do agree with the posters above. Edit: You can't always trust the spelling on the Internet. (except in electronic dictionaries, in most cases) Does the possessive always have the appostrophe? (the dog's tail, the man's hat, the cat's eyes) NO! Definitely not for pronouns. The kitten licked its paw. The woman said the purse was not hers. The children thought the lost puppy was theirs. And so forth. As for nouns, however, it is a different story. At the moment, I cannot think of a case when a possessive noun does not require an apostrophe. I just looked op "to wield" in Marriam-Webster online, is the use of the apostrophe in the word "one's" not incorrect in this case? (Personal pronoun...?) 3 a : to exert one's authority by means of b : have at one's command or disposal No, "one's" is an exception to the rule that says you don't use apostrophes in personal pronouns. So if one's to use the personal pronoun one in its possessive form then one should know that one is this one case needs to use the apostrophe.. As a difference to what happens to the other personal pronouns.. I Believe I got it..! (Sorry, sense of humour overload, ignore!) I believe that the only exceptions for using an apostrophe are the possessive adjectives: my, your, his, her, its, our, their, and the possessive pronouns: mine, yours, his, hers, its, ours, theirs. Thank you, I guess I seriously need a grammar course! >>_
