You can't perform that action at this time because you're unable to track your music listening history across platforms and devices right now. However, the Universal Scrobbler will continue to work even though the Last.fm site may be experiencing some major upgrades that have affected many users. These changes were supposed to improve the user experience but may cause disruptions until they get fully implemented. Some people are unhappy with these updates which is why I made this tool to help enhance your Last.fm experience by filling in gaps where functionality might be missing. You can try contacting me for further assistance or submit feedback on how you can help during this transition period. test account first and see if the things you want to scrobble work correctly, especially when scrobbling many tracks at once. Be cautious with your accounts, as there is now a daily limit of 2500 scrobbles due to previous issues with over-scrobbling. A "scrobble queue" is planned to allow for more scrobbles in the future. For now, check your remaining scrobbles in the user selection view. This tool remains free but donations support its development. Features include Paste Your Taste CSV Downloader Collage Creator Milestone Checker for entering artist, track, and album info and scrobbling tracks. It also allows searching Last.fm, Discogs, or MusicBrainz, loading files (csv, json), and fetching recent scrobbles of any last.fm user. The file parse scrobbling has two modes: Normal Mode, where only scrobbles newer than 14 days can be scrobbed, and Import Mode, which allows for older scrobbles by calculating timestamps from the "Finish Time" and duration. The tool also supports selecting music files (.flac, .mp3, .m4a, .wma) and scrobbling them, with timestamps reversed to end with the "Finishing Time". Some media players store their song library in a specific file, often storing information on how many times a specific song has been played. Scrobbling media player history to Last.fm is possible via third-party tools. For example, using a script called "Scrobble Now" allows you to import complete listening histories from iTunes, Winamp and Windows Media Player into last.fm. This can be useful even if timestamps are incorrect. The scrobbed songs will start with the latest track in the list and finish with the earliest one.
