In 1938, a substance called LSD joined the lineup of hallucinogenic drugs when Swiss chemist Albert Hofmann accidentally discovered it while working to create a blood stimulant. As psychiatrists and pharmaceutical companies experimented with the drug throughout the next three decades, samples of it were distributed throughout the populace and people began to discover the power behind this potent hallucinogenic. It became an iconic drug for hippies in the 60s who followed psychologist Timothy Leary's instruction to "turn on, tune in, and drop out." While it's not as popular as it was during the Flower Power era, LSD use is still going strong today. One thing that makes today's LSD use different from decades ago is the prevalence of counterfeit drugs. With LSD illegal and unregulated in most places, whenever you pop an acid tab, you always take the chance of ingesting something that isn't LSD at all. You'll always run that risk unless you use an LSD test kit to make sure that what you're being sold really is acid and that it's not cut or contaminated with something that's cheaper or potentially dangerous. If you're not sure how to test LSD, rest assured that you don't have to take it in to a laboratory to find out what's in it. Substance test kits make verifying the contents of your drugs a quick and easy process. Ehrlich Test Kits The first question you want answered when you test a potential LSD sample is: does it actually contain any LSD? The Ehrlich test is the most reliable way to get a straight-up yes or no answer. The testing fluid (a mix of ethanol, hydrochloric acid, and -dimethylaminobenzaldehyde) will turn purple if it detects LSD or other indoles. It will not react to the presence of 25i-NBOMe (a nasty substitute for LSD that will be discussed in more detail later). While some sources suggest that a Marquis test will change to a black or olive green color if it detects LSD, real-world use of these tests don't bear this out. In fact, if you do note an olive green/black color change with a Marquis test, it could potentially be caused from the ink or the paper itself. This is why Ehrlich is the gold standard when it comes to buying LSD test kits. After confirming the presence (or absence) of LSD with an Ehrlich test, move on to other LSD testing kits to further investigate the contents of a substance. Marquis Test Kits Sometimes, the result of your Ehrlich test kit may indicate that there is very little or no LSD present in your sample. If that happens, you have the option of tossing it out or investigating to find out what it is. Even if the Ehrlich shows the presence of LSD, this doesn't mean that there aren't other substances mixed in, as well. That's where the other tests come in. Just because a Marquis test kit isn't helpful for detecting LSD doesn't mean it's not helpful for continued testing of your sample. You can use it to look for the presence of MDMA-type chemicals, as well as MDPV, DXM, 2C-B, and speed. This is helpful in knowing what effects to expect when you ingest the substance, as well as avoiding potentially dangerous or deadly effects or interactions. Mecke Test Kits Next in the LSD test kit lineup is the Mecke test. This one will react to the presence of opiates. It will also let you know if your sample contains 2c-T-x compounds, as well as showing significantly different results between DXM and MDMA-like substances (the Marquis test turns the same color for both). While opiates and MDMA are used as recreational drugs, their effects are quite different than those of LSD. Identifying their presence in a sample can better help you decide whether to take it or toss it out. Mandelin Test Kits Still not sure what's in your sample? The Mandelin test kit will tell you if it contains the dangerous adulterants PMA or PMAA. The Mandelin testing fluid will also change colors if your sample contains amphetamines, specific opiates, MDxx, and 2C-type chemicals. Like the Marquis and Mecke tests, the Mandelin test is not helpful in testing for LSD but should be used to rule out or confirm the presence of other substances. If you're testing at home, use a white ceramic plate to better see any potential color change. Place a couple of drops of testing liquid onto your sample, making sure the sample does not touch and contaminate the bottom nozzle. The color change will take anywhere from 30 seconds to three minutes. You'll see a color change to purple for LSD, DMT, 5-MeO-DMT, 5-Meo-DIPT, psilocybin psilocin, AMT, and other indoles. Note that 1P-LSD will take much longer (one to three hours, even) and the color change will likely be more subtle than with traditional LSD. Because the effects of LSD vary so much from one person to the next – with one person experiencing an intense, monumental high and the next person feeling next-to-nothing, for example, attempts to study and explain the exact way LSD affects the brain have yielded conflicting results. Studies have shown that for some people, LSD causes them to actually be able to see the activity going on in their brain. Some researchers believe this may be the reason behind the visual distortions and hallucinations that are the signature of LSD lore. Other researchers have found that in some cases, LSD makes changes to the parts of the brain that are involved with introspection and perception of the outside world. This may be the explanation behind some LSD users feeling as though the drug gives them a greater and deeper connection to everything around them during a trip. Because LSD is still illegal in most places, attempts to thoroughly research it have been greatly hampered. In fact, scientists are still working to put together the puzzle that is LSD and how it interacts with a variety of human brains. LSD and Your Body While people primarily think of LSD as a "mind drug," it also has some rather marked effects on the body. After it kicks in, people may notice their blood pressure, heart rate, and body temperature begin to rise. People often can't sleep while they're feeling the effects of LSD – possibly because of the stimulation to their blood pressure and heart rate. LSD can create feelings of weakness, numbness, or tremors in the muscles throughout the body. It can also cause you to feel dizzy and lightheaded. Many people experience a dry mouth, a loss of appetite, and some notice profuse sweating while under the influence of the drug. For some, the negative side effects overpower the positive ones, but for other folks, an LSD trip is a wildly enjoyable experience. Everyone won't necessarily experience any or all of these effects, but these are how the brain and body commonly react once LSD kicks in. Another potential ingredient, DOI, is commonly described as "Super LSD" due to its incredibly powerful effects. For some, the promise of a longer, stronger trip may sound appealing, but even they should be leery of other common ingredients masquerading as LSD in today's market. 25i-NBOMe, also known as "N-bomb" or "smiles," is a LSD-like synthetic that's sending people not only to the hospital – it's sending them to the morgue. In addition to death, it causes mild hallucinations (sometimes leading to overdoses when seasoned trippers think it's not working), freak-outs, nausea, constriction of the blood vessels that leads to stabbing sensations under the skin, and seizures. The potential results of ingesting 25i-NBOMe can be so deadly that the US Drug Enforcement Agency has called taking even small doses of N-bomb "a game of Russian Roulette." This is why learning how to test LSD properly and always taking the time to do so is a good idea. It could help you avoid a nasty trip (either in your mind or a real-life trip to the hospital). Includes test result guide and full instructions. Each bottle allows testing of approximately 40 samples.The first test to use in this pack is the ehrlich reagent. It will go purple or pink if it is exposed to an indole compound like LSD, an analogue of LSD or a tryptamine. If an LSD blotter does not change colour with ehrlich then it does not contain LSD. Phenethylamines (like 2C-B, DOB or NBOMe) will not give a colour change with the ehrlich reagent so are detected with the froehde and marquis reagent. These reagents make all paper go slightly brown but if other colours are seen then this indicates the presence of another drug. LSD on blotter does not change colour, so if a colour change is seen with marquis or froehde then other compounds may be present. These reagents have a shelf life of 12-18 months when stored in the fridge. All our products are shipped in high quality glass bottles to reduce degradation from light, moisture and reactions with plastics which will shorten shelf lives. After removing from the fridge make sure you let the reagent warm up and dry off before opening the lid. If you can't store them in the fridge then keep them in a cool, dark place where the marquis reagent will last around 6 months and the froehde and ehrlich about 12 months. Please note that this uses matrix-bound test technology and is not a liquid. We no longer sell the old liquid test technology.
